- SABS appointed as Inspectorate of VTS's in 1990

SABS Inspectorate as the Inspectorate of Vehicle Test Stations

- no conflict of interest
- Confidentiality
- Responsible for maintaining and improving standard to Best international Practice

SABS Auditors – internal registration process, training, mentoring and peer reviews

- Minimum qualifications as determined by Minister of Transport and in accordance with MOA
- Internal training and registration
- Peer reviews

Mandate of the Inspectorate

- Determine the suitability and grading of new VTS's in terms of Legislation (NRTA 93/1996)
- Evaluate each VTS minimum of once per annum
- Monitor Standards applied at VTS's
- Advise VTS's on maintenance and improvement of facilities and procedures
- Shall, when necessary, recommend to the MEC the suspension or cancellation of a VTS
- May at any reasonable time inspect and test any motor vehicle at any VTS
- May without prior notice enter/inspect any VTS and question personnel on operational matters at VTS

Initial evaluation process and creation of the Quality Assurance System in terms of the South African National Standard

- New applications (notification from Province)
- VTS upgrades (notification from Province)
- Conduct Information sessions in Provinces on their request
- Do statistical analysis of test data, and subsequent investigations related to the results. (eNaTIS)

Initial Provisional registration status of existing Vehicle Test Stations

- Currently facing a challenge with regard to some VTS's in some Provinces that still does not comply.
- The SABS and the Provincial Departments of Transport in
- affected Provinces have embarked on a short, and long term intervention plan to get such VTS's to comply.

Maintaining and improving the Standard to best International Practice

- QMS
- Corrective action and focus preventative action
- More focus on preventative action to stop repetative behaviour from VTS's

The involvement of the Inspectorate in SADC and other Committees

- Harmonization of SANS Standards in SADC countries
- Road safety conference and Road Safety Initiatives toward a decade of action (WHO)

Consumer Protection Act and the Test Station Industry – Service delivery

- Complaints
- Technical inquiries
- Investigations

- Periodic vehicle testing increased capacity
