

MARC SHOTTEN

Road Safety Specialist, World Bank

Marc Shotten is Program Manager of the Global Road Safety Facility (GRSF), housed in the World Bank's Transport and Information and Communication Technologies Global Practice in Washington D.C. Since 2006, he has helped lead the development of safe road mobility programs to low- and middle-income countries, working closely with the transport lending operations of the World Bank Group. In this regard, he works directly with client governments, international partner agencies, the private sector, and non-governmental organizations (NGOs). He is the current Chair of the United Nations Road Safety Collaboration Working Group on Road Safety Management, Advisor to the Federation International de L'Automobile (FIA) High Level Panel on Road Safety, and past Executive Board member of the International Roads Federation. Mr. Shotten was a lead author on "Transport for Health" (2014), by The World Bank and Institute for Health Metrics and Evaluation, the first attempt to quantify the global burden of disease from motorized road transport. Prior to his current position, Mr. Shotten held assignments in the World Bank's East Asia Infrastructure Division and Development Economic Research Group. He holds degrees from Tufts University and the London School of Economics.

SPIROS T. VOYADZIS

President, Partnership for Finance and Development (PFD Group)

Prior to 2000 and for some 20 years, Mr. Voyadzis held up various distinguished functions for the World Bank Group in Washington D.C. and abroad as a staff member, manager, and senior manager. He took up his latest appointment for the World Bank as Special Representative to the European Union Institutions in Brussels in January 1996. He opened the Bank Office in Brussels and was its very first Director. As such, he was in charge of the World Bank's operational cooperation with the European Commission (EC), the European Investment Bank (EIB) and the European Bank for Reconstruction and Development (EBRD). This cooperation in programs/projects and in economic/physical infrastructure exceeded \$1.4 billion per year and was geared primarily to Eastern and Central Europe-countries ranging from Russia, to the accession to the EU states, to the Balkans and to Mediterranean and Africa countries. Prior to bringing his expertise to the Brussels office, Mr. Voyadzis headed Country Operations Divisions in World Bank Operations. He has written and published several articles and reports on economic development issues. He had also participated as keynote speaker in seminars on economic development and private sector investment around the world. He has regularly lectured at the College de l'Europe in Bruges, and at the Economics Departments of the Universities of Brussels and Louvain. Over the years, Spiros Voyadzis has had several appearances on CNN, the PBS News, BBC, other TV and Radio networks and was the subject numerous interviews by European newspapers and magazines. He is supporting many international welfare organizations.
